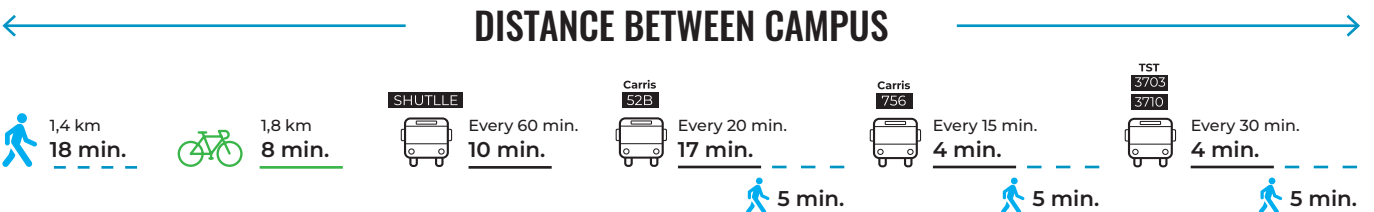

STUDENTS FROM EU COUNTRIES

The right to entrance, permanency, and residence in Portugal encompasses citizens of member countries of the European Union (EU), the European Economic Space (EEE), and Switzerland, as well as their family members. However, if you will be staying in the country for more than 3 months, you may have to go (for specific cases) to the Câmara Municipal (City Council) of your residential area, no later than 30 days before the end of your period of 3 months of entrance in the national territory.

STUDENTS FROM NON-EU COUNTRIES – GETTING THE STUDY VISA

Foreign students from outside the EU must bring their passport. For citizens of some countries, an entrance visa may also be required. The study visa may be obtained in a diplomatic mission or consular post abroad Portugal. HEALTH AND INSURANCE

In Portugal, the provision of healthcare is undertaken by the SNS – Serviço Nacional de Saúde, including health centres and public hospitals. Emergency services in hospitals should only be used in serious situations.

European Union (EU) and Swiss students can be included in the “SNS” system, through the **European Health Insurance Card**. It is very important to obtain this card in your home country, since without it you may be subjected to high prices for medical assistance. In order to obtain this card before coming to Portugal, foreign students should contact their local Social Service Centre. Students from countries outside the EU, should make sure they have a health insurance before departure, which covers their stay in Portugal. In the case of an emergency, go to the nearest public **Hospital**, or **Centro de Saúde**, with your European Health Insurance Card (EHIC), and you can be treated as a Portuguese citizen.

Upon registration, NOVA FCSH provides **school insurance** for all Erasmus+ students, which covers accidents occurred in and outside the Faculty’s facilities (outdoor classes, excursions, etc.) and in the normal and direct route between school and the student residence.

NOVA students are also entitled to **medical care** through **NOVA’s Social Services (SASNOVA)** or through **SAMS (private)** at reduced prices, by appointment - as our student you have the right to medical assistance (general practice) at a reduced price, provided by SAMS (Social Assistance Medical services).

LIVING IN LISBON

TRAVELING BY AIR

Lisbon is just a few hours (2 to 3 hours) away from most European cities and 6 to 8 hours away from North America. Lisbon’s international airport is only 7 km away from the city centre. To get from the airport to the city centre, there are several options:

Metro: Aeroporto station is about 15 minutes away.

Local buses: buses number 705, 708, 722, 731, 744, 783 (from 6am to 9.30pm) and bus number 208 (from 11pm to 4am).

Taxis: available 24h a day; journey time is 15-30 minutes and costs 10-15€.

TRAVELING BY TRAIN

Students who arrive by train will get off at Oriente station or at Santa Apolónia station, just a few minutes away from the old centre of Lisbon. Both stations are connected to the Lisbon metro and local buses.

TRAVELING INSIDE LISBON

There is a vast network of public transport in Lisbon and you can choose from the bus, the subway, the elevator, the tram or the train, in the city or the suburbs.

The tram and bus tickets can be purchased at any sales outlet or inside buses, directly from the driver, at a higher rate. The metro tickets must be purchased at the respective stations. There are [monthly passes](#) for bus travel / tram / metro valid and rechargeable prepaid travel cards.

The [The Navegante ocasional card](#) can be used as a multimodal ticket in the different city transport networks and suburbs. This rechargeable card can be purchased in retail outlets of the different transport operators, CTT and Payshop agents.

[Carris](#), a public transport company (bus and tram), covers the area of the entire city of Lisbon. Most buses and trams circulate between 6am and 11pm, while a night service that runs from 11pm to 4am. On the weekend services are substantially reduced.

[Metropolitano de Lisboa](#) is the easiest means of transport and the fastest for circulating in the city and runs between 6am and 1am.

In recent years, Lisbon has been remodeling its traffic system to one that is more inclusive to both pedestrians and bike riders and, consequently, more environmentally sustainable. You can find all bike paths that are available in Lisbon and other parts of the country on this [website](#). Lisbon’s municipality provides a network of shared bikes, with monthly and daily passes available - [GIRA](#).



CURRENCY

The Euro is the official currency of Portugal and [nineteen other EU countries](#). Coins have eight denominations: 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 and 50 cents and 1 and 2 euros. The bank notes have the following values: 5, 10, 20, 50, 100 and 200.

ELECTRICITY

Voltage: 230/400 volts at a frequency of 50 Hertz. All sockets follow European standards. To use American-type plugs, a 230-volt transformer should be used together with an adapter plug.

WINTER AND SUMMER TIME FOR PORTUGAL

A time change happens in Portugal twice a year, the first on the last Sunday of March and the second on the last Sunday of October.

CLIMATE

Lisbon has one of the mildest climates in Europe. It has a climate similar to Mediterranean countries, while the moderating effect of the Atlantic Ocean prevents it from being neither too hot in summer nor too cold in winter. Lisbon is also very sunny, with around 260 days of sunshine per year and almost 9 hours a day.

LANGUAGE(S) OF INSTRUCTION & REQUIRED LANGUAGE SKILLS

PORTUGUESE A2 OR ABOVE

At NOVA FCSH Portuguese is the main language of instruction. Therefore, when applying to NOVA FCSH, incoming students will have to present a certificate of Portuguese level A2 or higher ([Common European Framework of Reference](#)).

Certificates accepted for Portuguese :

A2 certificate issued by the [Department of Portuguese as a Foreign Language \(PLE\)](#).

or

[Initial Certificate of Portuguese as a Foreign Language \(CIPLÉ\)](#) or higher issued by a Center for Assessment and Certification of Portuguese as a Foreign Language (CAPLE). You can see [here](#) which CAPLE is closest to you.

or

A2 certificate issued by a Higher Education Institution.

Exceptions:

- Students from Portuguese-speaking countries
- If the courses selected are taught exclusively in other languages
- Students who only carry out research for their thesis during their stay at NOVA FCSH.



ENGLISH B1 OR ABOVE

Each semester, there are some courses lectured in English or other languages, mainly in the Department of Modern Languages, Cultures and Literatures. The list is updated every semester on the page International Curricula (link above). However, the offer in English is limited and does not include courses from all areas/departments. In that case, students will have to attend courses in their department lectured in Portuguese. To be able to select courses in English, you will need an English certificate at level B1 or higher.

Certificates accepted for English:

B1 certificate or higher issued by a Higher Education Institution or a language institute (stamped and signed);

or

Certificate of grades issued by a university where the student has successfully completed the English Language subject at the required level or higher;

or

Declaration issued by the home university indicating that the student has successfully attended classes taught in English and is capable of following classes lectured in that language.

PORTUGUESE LANGUAGE AND CULTURE COURSES

SEMESTER COURSE

The [Portuguese as a Foreign Language](#) courses are coordinated scientifically and pedagogically by the [Department of Linguistics](#).

To help incoming students comply with the language requirements they have:

- Online Intensive Courses for Level A2 (to be taken before mobility period)
- Portuguese Language examination for mobility purposes (to be taken before mobility period)

If students wish to improve the Portuguese language skills during their stay in Lisbon, they also have semester-long courses. This course can be included in the Learning Agreement and grants 6 ECTS. For more information contact cursoportugues@fcsch.unl.pt

ACADEMIC INFORMATION

NOVA FCSH offers a diverse number of undergraduate, master and PhD degrees, in fields within the Social Sciences and Humanities, supported by quality research, and taught by highly qualified academic staff.
All courses have been adapted in line with the Bologna reform and are measured in terms of ECTS credits.

IMPORTANT: Not all subjects are available every year/semester, so whilst making your course selection, students must always check the available timetables. Changes to the Learning Agreement may be done every semester, upon arrival – the first version is just a draft.




ACADEMIC CALENDAR

The academic year at NOVA FCSH usually commences in September until June. Exact dates are available on [NOVA FCSH's website](#). The period of student mobility can only be testified according to our academic calendar – please consider this when establishing your grant with your home institution.

REQUIREMENTS FOR COURSE SELECTION

In the process of applying to NOVA FCSH, the student prepares a Learning Agreement (LA) , which contains, among other information, the courses the student plans to attend. The preparation of the LA must comply with the following criteria:

- Minimum: one course;
- Maximum: 30 ECTS. In addition to the 30 ECTS, the student can add the LA the semester course of Portuguese for Foreigners, of 6 ECTS;
- Mandatory registration in at least one course from the department the student was nominate to (according to a bilateral agreement between the universities). The remaining courses may be from other departments/study areas at NOVA FCSH;
- Bachelor students can attend courses from bachelor programs;

- Master’s students must take at least one course at master level (ideally from the department they have been nominated to at NOVA FCSH). Master students can also attend courses at bachelor level;

- Doctoral students must take at least one course at doctoral level (ideally from the department they have been nominated to at NOVA FCSH). Doctoral students can also attend courses at bachelor and master levels;

- Students must attend the welcome meeting , which will take place before the beginning of the semester. Failing to attend the meeting, the student will have to register their arrival in person at the Mobility Office Assistance Desk as soon as possible. Students arriving after the first two weeks of classes will not be accepted.

EVALUATION & CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM (GRADES)

At NOVA FCSH, students are evaluated based on the work developed over the semester, considering class participation, presentation of written and oral tests and final examinations.

IMPORTANT: The evaluation elements, their weighting and scheduling are set in the first two weeks of the semester between teacher and students.

The evaluation is expressed on a scale of 0 to 20. Approval is obtained with a grade of 10 or above. Until the end of the semester's class period, students are evaluated based on the work developed during the semester, according to the criteria defined by the teacher (group works, tests, individual assignments, etc.) Students who fail a course with a grade of 8/20 or 9/20 may request an **Appeal Examination** (free of charge). The request is made by Request in Info-estudante, during the period defined for this purpose in the [Academic Calendar](#).

Students may, if they wish, enrol for an **Improvement Examination**, applicable to courses completed with a positive grade (above 10/20) that you wish to improve. Registration for this exam costs €15 and is requested through an application at Info-estudante, in the period defined for this purpose in the [Academic calendar](#).



ENROLMENT AT NOVA FCSH

Once the Mobility Office registers your arrival, you will be enrolled for the courses you selected in Info-estudante upon application. Any changes need to be requested to the Mobility office (in person or via email) during the first two weeks of the semester. More info will be provided at the Welcome Meeting.
